SEVEN PILGRIMS WALK 110 MILES FROM THE BRONX TO SOUTH PHILADELPHIA

WHAT:

The <u>National Shrine of Saint Rita of Cascia</u> (cash-uh), in partnership with <u>Modern Catholic Pilgrim</u> and the <u>Augustinian Province of Saint Thomas of Villanova</u>, is sponsoring a walking pilgrimage from Saint Nicholas of Tolentine Parish in the Bronx, New York, to the Shrine in South Philadelphia during the week of March 3, 2024. Seven young adults will walk 110 miles over the course of seven days before reaching their destination.

As the pilgrims make their journey (roughly 15 to 20 miles each day), they will follow in the spiritual footsteps of Saint Augustine (uh-gus-tin) of Hippo and many of the saints he inspired. This pilgrimage is being led by an Augustinian Friar, Fr. Jeremy Hiers, O.S.A.

WHY:

Thousands of people travel across the world for large-scale pilgrimages each year, most popularly to the Camino de Santiago, the Holy Land, or Rome. Yet, there are holy sites all over the world, many in our own backyards.

With support and guidance from Modern Catholic Pilgrim, this walking pilgrimage returns to the basics: setting a holy destination and bringing prayerful intentions along the journey. In this way, the idea of a pilgrimage as something only available in a far-off land is reimagined, and opportunities for everyone to experience the fruits of deepening faith and building community through pilgrimage are created.

About the Augustinian Province of St. Thomas of Villanova:

The Augustinian Province of Saint Thomas of Villanova is a mendicant order of friars living in Augustinian communities on the east coast of the United States and in Japan. Inspired by the teaching of Saint Augustine of Hippo, the Province was established in 1874, and today is comprised of 153 friars in 20 communities. The Augustinian Province of Saint Thomas of Villanova serves the Church and its communities by working in collaboration with lay men and women. Together, they build Christian communities in education, parishes, foreign missions in Japan and Peru and ministering to the marginalized and underserved in the inner-city. The Province founded and, owns or sponsors Villanova University, Merrimack College, Malvern Preparatory School, and Saint Augustine Preparatory School. It administers 10 parishes in Massachusetts, New York and Pennsylvania, and four in Japan, as well as the National Shrine of Saint Rita of Cascia in Philadelphia.
